Behind God's back

There's a verse in the Bible, Isaiah 43, verse 25 that says, basically, God blots out your transgressions and doesn't remember your sins. What a comforting concept. If we have corrected a mistake, God doesn't remember the mistake. And we don't have to keep rehashing it either. The mistake is corrected. God has erased the transgression and there's nothing left to remember.

I relate another Bible verse with this concept. It's Isaiah 38, verse 17 which says, basically, God has cast all your sins behind His back. I love this.
